



Julie prepares the budget for the next year at this time every year. There are plans for some repairs, improvements, and more landscaping. Shade Wanted On Little Dry Creek Trail

WHCA and Walnut Hills GID are working together to budget, gain permissions and select permanent shade structures for the benches along Little Dry Creek Trail by Walnut Hills Elementary. While there are still many items to take care of, the WHCA and GID hope to have this project completed before the snow flies! Thank you to our residents for making the suggestion that some shade along the trail would be much appreciated!

2019 Waterline Replacement Project Update

As of July 17th, over 50% (7,500 feet) of the waterline in the project has been installed. The project is currently on budget and the contractor Brannon Construction is ahead of schedule. The installation of the water line should be completed in early September with the final site-wide paving and restoration to be completed in late September.

The Southgate Water District would like to thank the Walnut Hills residents for their patience and understanding during this project. Waterline replacement projects are very disruptive to a neighborhood; however, they are an important part of maintaining the infrastructure to provide reliable water service for decades to come.




