Project Team Celebrates "Hats Off" Grand Opening for I-25/Arapahoe Road Interchange Dec. 14, 2017

GREENWOOD VILLAGE—CDOT and contractor Kraemer North America hosted a ribbon cutting ceremony celebrating the substantial completion of the Interstate 25 and Arapahoe Road Interchange Reconstruction project. This work has been completed seven months ahead of schedule.

Although the project is substantially complete, landscaping and final punchlist (touch-up) items will continue through next spring. Intermittent lane restrictions may be required to complete this work.

Construction began in May 2016, with a commitment to complete the project by July 2018. Speakers celebrated the early completion by throwing plastic, yellow hard hats into the air.

"This project is helping to reduce congestion and improve traffic operations and safety," said CDOT Executive Director Mike Lewis. "It's also a great example of partnering. We can accomplish a lot when we pool our collective resources for improving our transportation system."

The project's \$66 million construction budget came from CDOT's Responsible Acceleration of Maintenance and Partnerships (RAMP) program and local matching funds from Arapahoe County, the City of Centennial, the City of Greenwood Village and the Southeast Public Improvement Metropolitan District.

A ribbon hung between a Kraemer North America truck and a CDOT vehicle, illustrating the project's successful partnerships. Participants concluded the ceremony by cutting individual pieces of the ribbon as a keepsake.

Improvements made as a part of this project included:

Reconstructed the I-25 bridge over Arapahoe Road and provided three through lanes on Arapahoe Road under the bridge with a single barrier separating east/west traffic

Realigned the frontage road in the northeast quadrant of the interchange

Constructed an additional westbound lane on Arapahoe Road from Yosemite Street to Greenwood Plaza Boulevard

Widened Yosemite Street from Yosemite Circle on the north to Xanthia Street on the south

Constructed two noise walls: one along Yosemite Street south of Arapahoe Road to Xanthia Street, and another along the south side of Arapahoe Road from Uinta Street to Yosemite Street

Provided triple left turns from the I-25 off ramps

GID Update 2018 Is Off And Running!

2017 turned out to be an exciting year with many changes happening on the Walnut Hills perimeter - most notably the Arapahoe Road / I-25 construction. The construction is wrapping up and the Walnut Hills sign was reinstalled at the corner of Arapahoe and Unita the 2nd week of January. A few other projects and project updates include:

- The GID worked with the City of Centennial to get a bad section of concrete sidewalk along Quebec temporarily repaired. Permanent repairs will happen in the Spring/Summer 2018.
- The GID continues to coordinate with South Suburban Parks to replace a broken section of concrete on the new Little Dry Creek Trail on the Quebec side. This most likely won't happen until Spring/Summer 2018
- The GID is working with DaVinci Signs and the City of Centennial to get the sign replaced on Quebec and Costilla - this is the one that was damaged by a car accident. We anticipate that this will be done the end of February.
- Our wonderful handymen are working on both painting the Dry Creek side of the perimeter fence (approximately 1/4th of the way done at the time of this article) and making needed repairs including fixing fence posts. These activities will be done as weather allows and will be an on-going project for the foreseeable future.
- Holiday decorations were put up and taken down on the signs over the holiday season.

These projects are in addition to the weekly clean-up and maintenance items that go on. Trash and debris pick-up is the most notable regular maintenance this time of year.

Letter To The Editor

I have very serious concerns about Ms. Udells' proposal. Her desire to form a new organization ("Walnut Hills Community Service Organization") as reported in the November 9, 2017 Walnut Hills Civic Association (WHCA) Agenda, to "organize all three entities as a 501(c)(3)", as reported in the Minutes of the WHCA August 10, 2017, and available on the Walnut Hills website, seems to imply that she wishes to take control of The Newsletter, The Walnut Hills Civic Association and the Walnut Hills Scholarship Fund. She doesn't report what she means by, "all three entities" but they have been mentioned in discussion. I'm not sure how a 'new organization' can organize other "entities" unless there is a plan to take them over.

Now the question comes - Do we want another organization to take over the operation of the WHCA, the Newsletter, and the Scholarship Fund? I think not, they serve our community very well and I believe that most residents are very happy with the service these three entities give our community, or else they would not be so successful.

It is most interesting that Ms. Udell stated in a posting on "Next Door", (a posting that has since been removed) that, "WHCA is considering an HOA". She was an officer of the WHCA until she was removed, (Action reported in the WHCA Minutes of October 12, 2017), and as an officer she should have known this was not true. She also implied in her posting on "Next Door", that the WHCA is a "social" organization. It is so much more than that such as; Easter Egg Hunts, Dumpster Days, General Improvement District (GID), July 4th activates, Garage Sales, Landscaping and Christmas lighting Contests, plus taking a stand on numerous residential issues indicates. Maybe she was trying to gain support for her organization and raise questions about the WHCA, an organization that for 60 years has been a voice for the common interest and concerns of Walnut Hills residents, not just "social".

Just what is her "mission and vision" besides taking financial control of these three entities with a board that might be paid with our dollars, taking away money from scholarships for our high school graduates and WHCA community projects. Our Newsletter, Civic Association and Scholarship Fund do such a wonderful job. Let's continue to support all three of these organizations that do so much for our neighborhood.

I doubted if I should ever come back.


I shall be telling this with a sigh Somewhere ages and ages hence: Two roads diverged in a wood, and I— I took the one less traveled by, And that has made all the difference



We were a small two-person business with one studio in the early days. Today, we utilize an in-home studio as well as site visit service. AP Images still does sports photography and family portraits but have expanded our services. Our services also include business portraits, senior class pictures, glamour/boudoir, technical business documentation, and books. We also offer videography services on a limited basis. Perhaps you have seen some of our work in the Walnut Hills Newsletter.


I started in technical documentation over 25 years ago. At that time, I was shooting pictures to document work procedures and finished processes to demonstrate business capabilities. Photography provided proof of adherence to regulatory requirements during job processes involving hazardous and radioactive materials. In the last 15 years, we have shot pictures for two authors, covering seven books to date. Last year, AP Images' services were utilized to document microwave installations in Colorado, Wyoming, Nebraska, and South Dakota. Our work has taken us to three continents and five countries.

Our background includes using the ubiquitous Polaroid films for fast documentation to include simple compliance to the more exotic autoradiography of DNA gels. I worked with a limited number of film cameras, mainly Olympus, Canon, and Nikon. I have managed an E-6 film lab, developing films, and mastering the wet chemistry of film processing. With the advent of digital cameras, AP Images has used Kodak, Pentax, Olympus, and Nikon. Today, we use almost exclusively Nikon products.

We enjoy working with families. Candid children's pictures are a favorite because they are more honest and expressive. Those are moments in time that deserve to be captured compared to family portraits some of us were made to endure all those years ago. When the opportunity presents itself, I personally like to do pictures that have a more glamorous or artistic touch. I draw on the 30s/40s/50 film noir styling, the works of Rembrandt and Rodin provide inspiration, as well as classic Greek and Roman art.



Construction has started in Walnut Hills

Over the next six months, you'll see us hard at work, building and expanding the network and putting all the infrastructure necessities in place that make fiber work. When the network is ready to go, we'll start installing our first fiber customers in Phase 1B, anticipated to start Summer of 2018.


We plan to build the network out to most of Centennial. For the most up to date information regarding what neighborhoods we'll be building to next go to ting.com/centennial and click on News.

Phase 1A - Willow Creek 1 and 2 (currently under construction)

Phase 1B - Walnut Hills and Hunters Hill

Construction: Here's the plan

- In one day of work, we can typically construct the infrastructure of our network for 20 homes.
- Before we start construction a utility location service will mark the underground utilities in your neighborhood. This process ensures underground utilities won't be disrupted during construction.
- We bring the fiber line to your home by a method called directional boring. A directional bore will travel underground up to 300 feet and is directed to avoid underground utilities.
 The directional bore creates the path that will eventually house fiber conduit.
- Handholes are required every couple of house lengths.
 These Handholes are unobtrusive and look very much like the kind of recessed access hatch you might find in a lawn irrigation system.
