Inaugural Walnut Hills Disc Golf Tournament


Saturday morning, September 9th will be the inaugural Walnut Hills Disc Golf Tournament at Walnut Hills Park. This will be a 9-hole disc golf tournament that can be played and enjoyed by the whole family! (My family personally has had three generations playing together). If you can throw a Frisbee[®], you can play disc golf. There is no cost to enter, and there will be prizes for the top three players under 10, top three players 10 to 15, top three players 15 to 18, and the top three adults. Registration is on the day of the tournament only and will run from 8:30 am to 9:00 am at the Walnut Hills Park picnic shelter. The tournament begins at 9:00 am and will run to noon depending on the number of players. We will have a few discs available to borrow, but it would be great if you bring your own Frisbee[®] or disc.

Basic Tournament Rules:

Families or groups of friends are welcome to play in the same group in the tournament. Individual players will be paired up with other players. After registration, groups will be given a score card to keep track of each player. The game is basically played like ball golf except that a Frisbee[®] or disc is thrown instead. At each basket, players will take turns throwing their discs from the tee area towards the designated basket. The disc is picked up where it lands and then thrown again until it is thrown into one of the baskets. Each player keeps track of the number of throws it takes to make it into the basket and then written on the score card. The person with the least number of throws to complete all nine baskets wins!

Please see the map for the anticipated tournament layout and note that six of the baskets were installed in mid-August.

Colorado Outfitter Of The Year 2016








Summer Construction at Dry Creek and Walnut Hills Elementary

New Laws (Ordinances) in Centennial

The Centennial City Council has been working on passing the "nuisance" ordnances for a long while now. These came from the issues that get the most complaints in the City. I'll list the titles here with a brief description. Anyone wanting a full copy of either ordinance may email me to request.

1. ORDINANCE 17-O-13, AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CENTENNIAL AMENDING SECTIONS 7-1-60, 7-2-30 & 7-2-40 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE CONCERNING PROHIBITIONS ON STOCKPILING & INOPERABLE VEHICLES, & JUDICIAL ENFORCEMENT OF NUISANCE VIOLATIONS, AMENDING SECTION 12-3-608 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE CONCERNING REFUSE CONTAINERS, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS OF THOSE PROVISIONS.

This one is about junk in backyards and junk cars with no legal tags. It will only be enforced by complaint. You may now invite a code compliance officer into your home or backyard to look into a neighbor's yard to see the junk. It also includes the fact that unregistered or inoperable cars must be keep inside a building, no tarps or covers. Lastly garbage cans must be kept out of site before and after trash day.

2. ORDINANCE 17-O-14, AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CENTENNIAL AMENDING ARTICLE 2 OF CHAPTER 7 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION 7-20-90 TO DECLARE IT A NUISANCE & UNLAWFUL TO PERMIT DEAD, BROKEN, DISEASED OR INSECT INFESTED TREES ON PROPERTY, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY THEREFORE.

This one will only be complaint driven, as well. If you feel a dead tree presents a danger to your property, you'll be able to contact Code Compliance and they'll check it out. If they don't find it's a danger, there will be no ticket. If there is a danger, they will require the tree to be removed. The City is still figuring out how they can help the homeowner unable to do the removal. Remember, they must find a clear danger to your property, to act.

For both of these call 303-325-8000 to complain.

Ting Fiber

The City is continuing to lay the fiber backbone for internet providers to take advantage of. The backbone is in our "mile streets": Quebec, Arapahoe, Yosemite, and Dry Creek among many others.

Ting is the first internet provider to contract with the City to build the final mile, link homes to a fiber network in the backbone. Though Walnut Hills appears to be on the list of neighborhoods to be wired first, we need more people to sign up. This is a simple matter of going to www.ting.com/centennial and registering. The \$9 you pay to join will save you the about \$89 hook-up fee down the line. When the time comes and they knock on your door to verify your desire to join, you can back out and get your \$9 back. There will be at least 2 tiers of service. The expensive top tier will be the 1 gigabit service (tentatively at \$89 per month) and the less expensive one will be a slower service at a much lower price, rumored to be around \$30 per month. (It will still be much faster than the 4.55 mbps that Century Link is giving me at \$28/month.) You may go to http://speedtest.att.com/speedtest/ to check what you're getting with your internet connection.


- Here are the winners of the costume contest. 1. There were too many wonderfully decorated bikes/trikes to pick just one, so everyone was a winner in that category.





Blue Birds And Pelicans

Last year I grew a birdhouse gourd. Unfortunately, when I say I grew a gourd, that was about it, one. I kept it over winter and it dried out and crinkled. Come spring, instead of tossing it out, I cut a hole in the side and hung it from a pole in the yard. Now every day I watch the wrens flit about the yard finding insects to bring back to the gourd. They have started to trust me a bit more and almost never make their warning cry when I approach, but I haven't been able to see any occupant in the gourd as yet. The flickers, on the other hand, made their nest in a hollow in the rotten trunk of the maple tree. Their offspring have fledged and after a few days of boisterous encouragement from its parents, have flown the coop. All three of them seem to have simply moved on.

Of late, I have been watching some hawks that seem to be in some dispute about territory. The other day, I watched two of them involved in a bit of aerial acrobatics, as one tried to convince the other that visitors were not welcome. This morning, one of them landed on the top of the tall spruce tree up the hill and was quickly met with a blue jay who wasn't intimidated in the least. The hawk flew a bit, then landed on the telephone pole, followed quickly by the jay who landed on the wire. While the jay squawked and squealed, the hawk looked around a bit and flew off toward the west. Usually, the crows take up this job of harassing hawks, but of late I haven't seen them about. These days, with the larkspur and the daylilies coming into flower, the swallowtails and the humming birds are beginning to show themselves more.

In the early spring, up near the golf course that runs through Lone Tree, a flock of pelicans can often be seen in the pond near Cook Creek Pool. Around the beginning of June I saw about 15 of them fly overhead. I have no idea where they spend the summers, but they usually return for a brief period in the fall. A bit farther afield up near Daniels Park, you will find bluebirds. I have no idea why I only seem to find them up there. I assume they just prefer the high altitude, but I have no idea really. Maybe they just don't like lawn mowers.

I-25 Update

The I-25 and Arapahoe Road Interchange Reconstruction project team made substantial progress in the spring. Some of these major accomplishments include: completed I-25 paving, finished construction of the new I-25 bridges over Arapahoe Road, completed noise wall construction and completed four of five phases on Arapahoe Road.


