

We are so proud that our community has shown such financial support of the Walnut Hills graduates in their pursuit of a college education. Each year since the start of the scholarship program in 1972, thanks to the residents, we have been able to increase the amount and number of scholarships. This year, for

What Went Wrong?

Why do newly planted trees, shrubs and flowers seem to struggle? In a few words...Transplant Shock. It seems so simple - head to the garden center, pick up some lush, beautiful tree or shrub or flower, take it home and plant it. You do everything right. You amend the soil. You dig the hole just as deep and twice as wide, just like you were told. You water it in well. Then just a day or two later, it starts to wilt, turn brown. The leaves fall off. What's the problem? Where did you go wrong?!

You didn't go wrong. You don't have a black thumb. Chances are the plants are suffering from transplant shock. This term refers to various symptoms of stress caused by a limited root system. When you purchase a new plant, they will only have a small portion of their natural root system. This is for several reasons:

Perennials and Shrubs- the plant was started from seed and is just young, growing in ideal conditions with constant monitoring (i.e., a growing facility, or nursery) and in order to promote sales, many perennials and shrubs are closely controlled in the way of temperatures and nutrients to promote blooming. I for one have never seen a Black Eyed Susan blooming in May in the real world, but go to the Garden Center Mother's Day weekend, and they are awash with color.

Trees - trees are grown in the ground. When it is time to harvest, the trees are dug up, typically by mechanical means and packaged. This process does not get every root that the tree has established, but cuts the roots at a predetermined diameter. The spaded trees are then bound in burlap and a wire cage (known as B&B, for "ball and burlap") and then sent to their retail destinations for sale. Trees are also closely monitored during the growing process and dug at specific times of year. Trees however, are typically grown outdoors and so it is less common to control the cycle of the tree - for instance Crabapples bloom in the spring and only in the spring - you won't see blooms come July.

The plant is struggling to supply water and nutrients through this small or reduced root system. These symptoms are normal, and in most cases, the plants will recover once they start to establish roots in their new

Normal symptoms of transplant shock are:

- Wilting (or droopy) leaves and branches
- Brightly colored leaves, yellow or red occasionally the entire plant will turn its fall color
- Leaf scorch: the tips and edges of leaves are brown or the entire leaf turns brown and falls off
- Evergreen needles may turn brown
- Entire branches are bare or produce only a few

Plants (like kids) need help to grow up strong and healthy. As a rule of thumb, root establishment on trees takes 1 year for every 1" of trunk diameter. You can help to alleviate transplant shock, and help establish roots by following these tips:

- Water deeply and infrequently
- Apply mulch or rocks this protects the plants from competing weeds, grass and lawn mowers
- Fertilize use something specific to root simulation - there is a Fertilome product available called "Root Simulator"
- Winter water
- Wind protection

While not every plant will survive severe transplant shock, most of the time with some patience and observation, transplant shock can be reduced and treated so that you can enjoy the plants for many seasons (or years) to come!



the wrens who make a sort of zzzit zzzit zzzit sound whenever the neighborhood cats or I are around. They're like an early warning system. Though they are not as bad as those storm warnings on PBS that go on and on about how I am going to get killed by hail impaled by flying debris and drowned in floods while I am trying to watch a documentary about the weather.

Letter to the Editor

In the previous newsletter Maggie Haskett, manager for the General Improvement District (the perimeter) and a Walnut Hill resident offered free Iris and day lilies. The widening of Arapahoe road will take out flowers, sidewalk and everything but the fence, so it was felt that residents might want to have them rather than to see them bulldozed. Because of liability issues residents could not dig them up alone. Throughout the month of June Maggie spent many days and hours digging the flowers up, one clump at a time with almost no help. She had to park at the strip center to the east or Briarwood by the library to the west. A child's wagon was used to haul the flowers up or down to her vehicle. On arrival at home she put the plastic bags that she used to transport them on a bench in her front yard, then called/ emailed people to come help themselves. It was quite an undertaking, but 25 Walnut Hills homeowners now have free iris and day lilies in their yards. Thanks Maggie.






Walnut Hills Civic Associations's 4th of July




